

Keys of the Kingdom Game

Why:

Children understand the importance of listening and following directions.

What to do:

One student sits in a chair in the middle of the room away from everyone else. The student in the chair is blindfolded and there is a circle drawn around the chair. There is a set of keys or something that makes noise hanging on the chair and the other students must try, one at a time, to retrieve the keys without being heard. If the student in the chair thinks he or she hears someone inside the circle, he or she should raise his or her hand. If someone IS in the circle, that person goes to the back of the line. If someone is NOT in the circle, then the student in the chair loses and the next person gets to sit down.
