Introduction

Sources of Free Periodicals and Databases [ICE No. RE007] is compiled by the Peace Corps office of Information Collection and Exchange (ICE) to provide Peace Corps Volunteers with information on periodicals, databases, and CD-ROMs that can offer helpful information for primary and secondary projects. ICE regularly updates the data in this publication with information provided by the organizations listed. *All earlier versions of this publication are now obsolete and may contain misleading information. Please discard and recycle them.*

Many of the periodicals listed could be of use to counterparts. They might also be useful additions to a local library or resource center. Please do share the information contained in this publication with counterparts and librarians/resource center managers.

Some of the periodicals and CD-ROMs included in this listing are available in print format. Others are available only electronically and some are available in both hard copy and online. Some of the organizations require that you sign up to receive the free subscription. Others provide the periodicals online without subscription.

If you or your counterpart are interested in receiving any of the periodicals by subscription, please communicate directly with the organization listed. For sustainability, having a local library or resource center subscribe is preferable. If you subscribe in your own name to print publications, please notify the organization of your expected date of close of service and changes of address.

Print subscriptions take time to process and publications sent by surface mail can take six weeks or longer to reach their destination. Expect a delay between the time of ordering and the time the first issue arrives.

ICE provides some periodicals directly to Peace Corps Information Resource Centers (IRCs) in-country. Copies are sent to each IRC on the basis of current Peace Corps projects of the country. In some cases, multiple copies are provided. At least one copy is sent to each country that has a project related to the subject of the magazine. Periodicals sent by ICE are indicated by a note in the description of the magazine in this listing.



Before ordering any periodical listed directly, check in your Peace Corps IRC. The current issue may already be available for your use.

In addition to this publication, ICE has compiled two other publications to assist you and your counterpart in helping to develop local libraries and resource centers. *Sources of Donated Books* [ICE No. RE003] lists organizations that donate books to countries where Peace Corps has projects. *Libraries for All!: How to Start and Run a Basic Library* [ICE No. RE035] is a how-to guide for setting up a small library. Check in your IRC for copies of these publications. You may also order copies directly from ICE.
